Sherman's March Bus Tour
October 14, 2006

Tell your friends and relatives! The Sherman's March Bus Tour is back this fall. On Saturday, October 14th, this extremely popular tour will be given twice: 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Each narrated tour is approximately 3 hours and traces General Sherman's march from the battle at Congaree Creek through the Riverbanks Zoo and Garden and into Columbia.

You'll hear first hand accounts of Union soldiers, newspaper reporters and Columbia residents. Be prepared to stand on the original earthworks built for the Confederate defense, walk along the Saluda River to see the granite remains of one of the largest textile mills of the early 1800's, see the bridge abutments of the Gervais Street and Saluda River bridges burned by the Confederates and ride along the same streets Union soldiers traveled to enter Columbia.

The tour bus departs from the parking lot of the State Museum (301 Gervais Street) near Gervais Street.

Tickets are **\$15 per person** for the tour. Seats will be reserved on a **first-come, first-serve basis**. Seats are limited and will fill up quickly. **Please RSVP by August 12, 2006**. Indicate morning or afternoon tour preference.
